International Student Frequently Asked Questions

There is not waiver for this requirement.

Are there funds to help cover the cost of the transcript evaluation?

- No. All associated costs must be paid by the applicant.

Is a test of language proficiency required?

- Yes. Official scores on the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) or the academic version of the International English Language Testing System (IELTS) or Duolingo English Test are required for applicants from countries where English is not the primary language (scores cannot be more than 2 years old). A minimum score of 550 (paper-based) is required on the TOEFL. A minimum overall band score of 6.5 is required on IELTS, with a minimum band score of 6 on each of the four modules. More details are available on the Graduate School website. This requirement cannot be waived.

Are there scholarships available for international students?

- No specific scholarships to our program are currently available for international students. All available scholarship information is available at [WCU Scholarship Portal](#).

Are international students eligible for a graduate assistantship?

- All HESA students have a graduate assistantship. These are paid.
